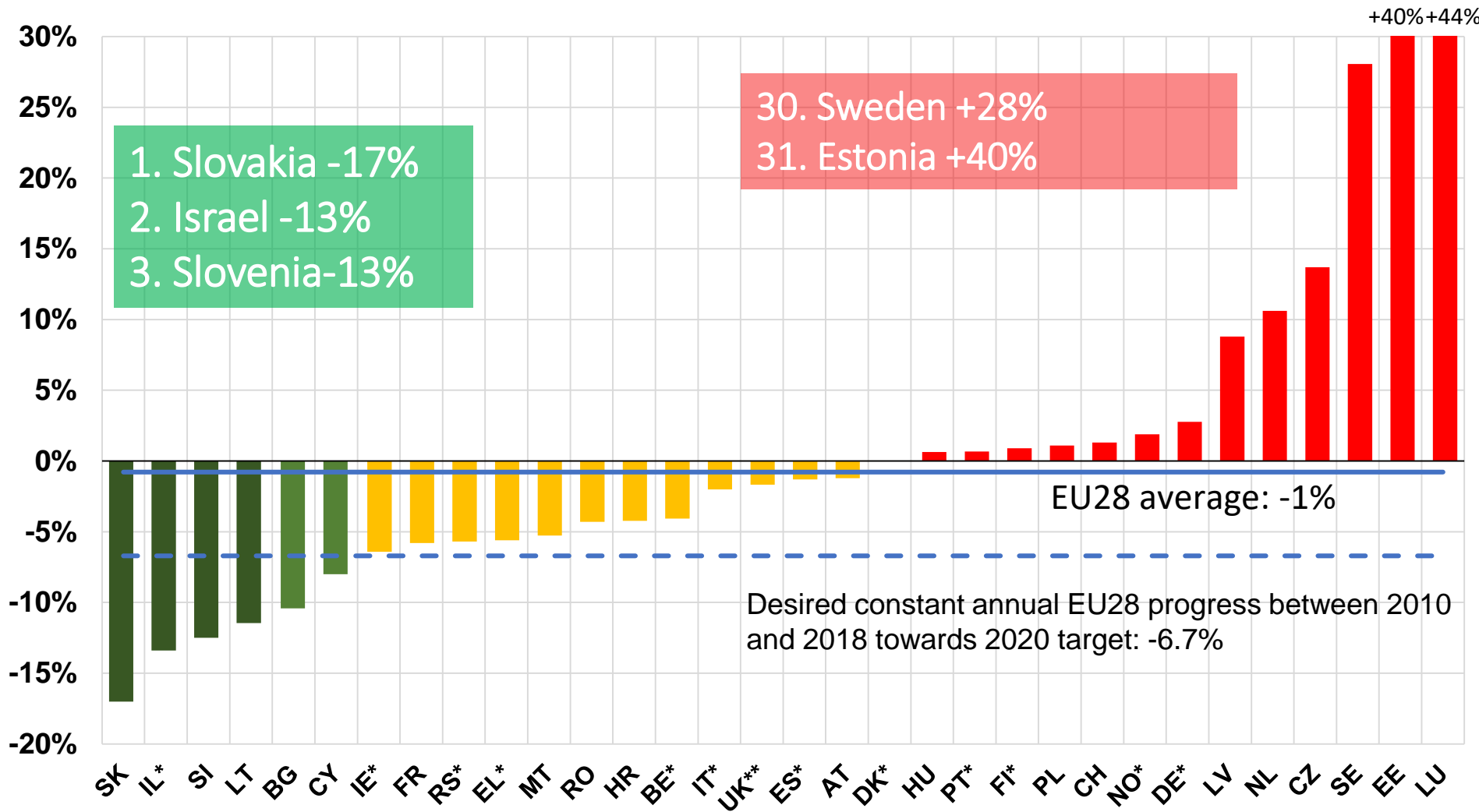

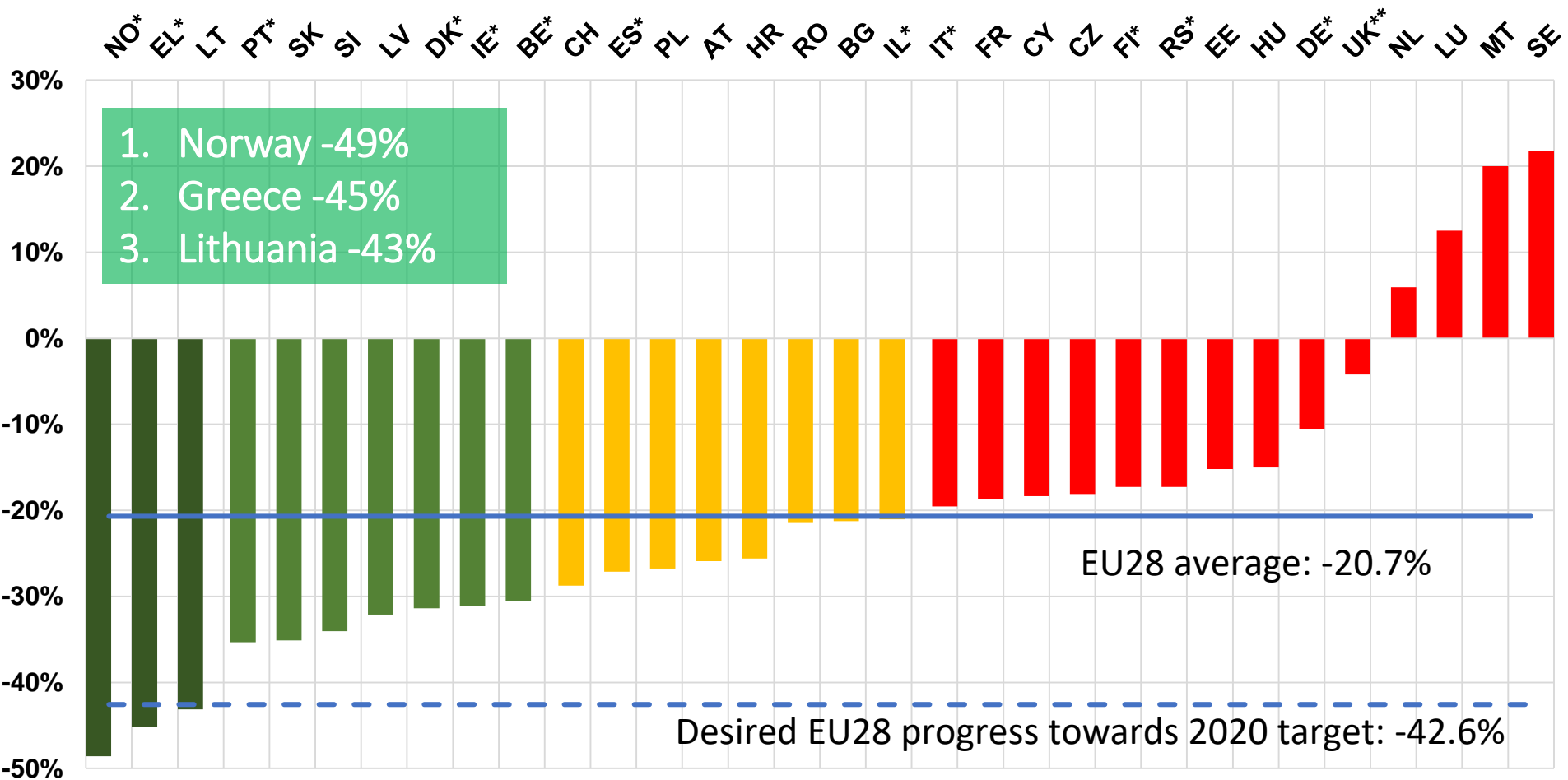

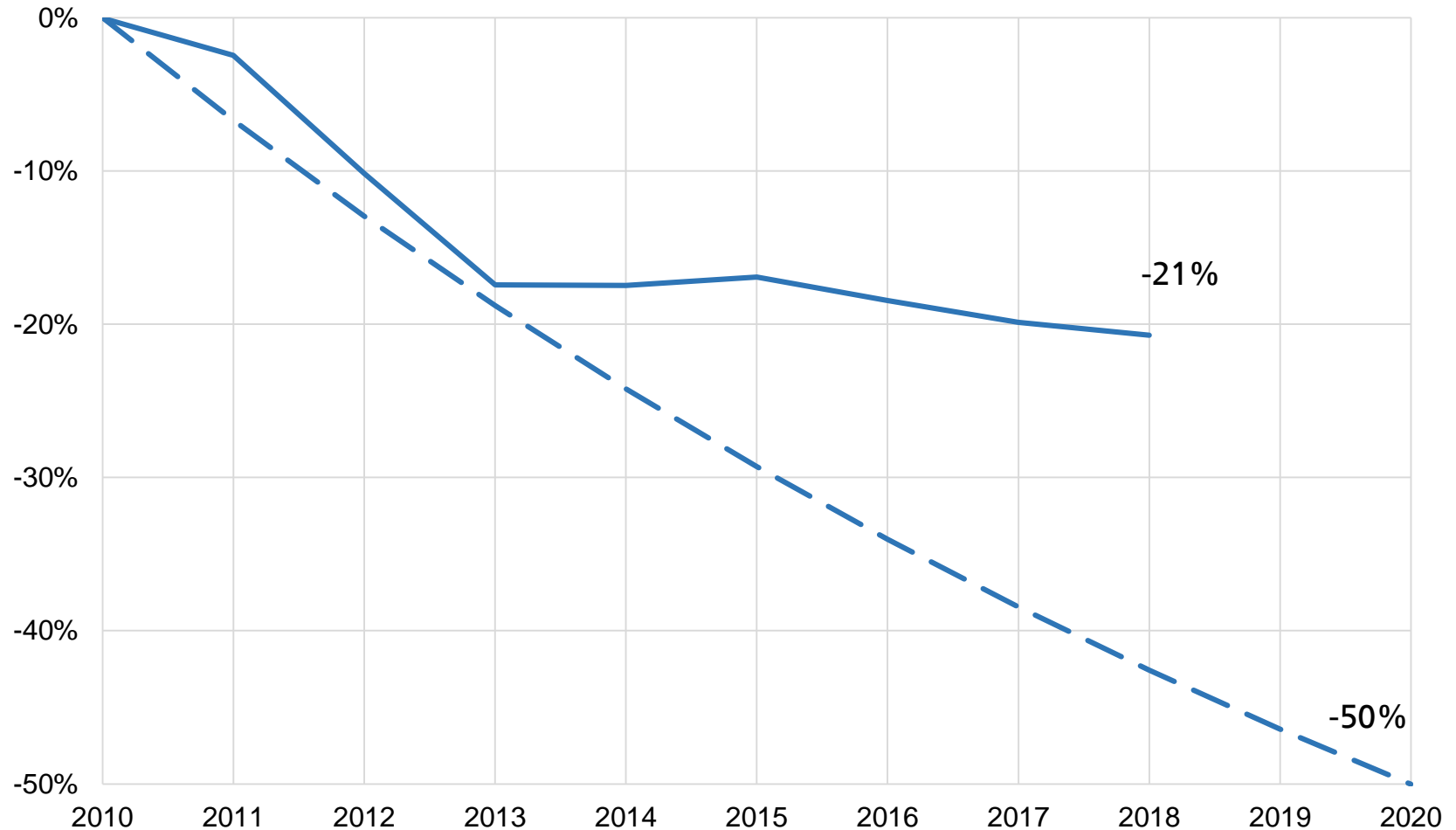
RELATIVE CHANGE (%) IN ROAD DEATHS 2017-2018



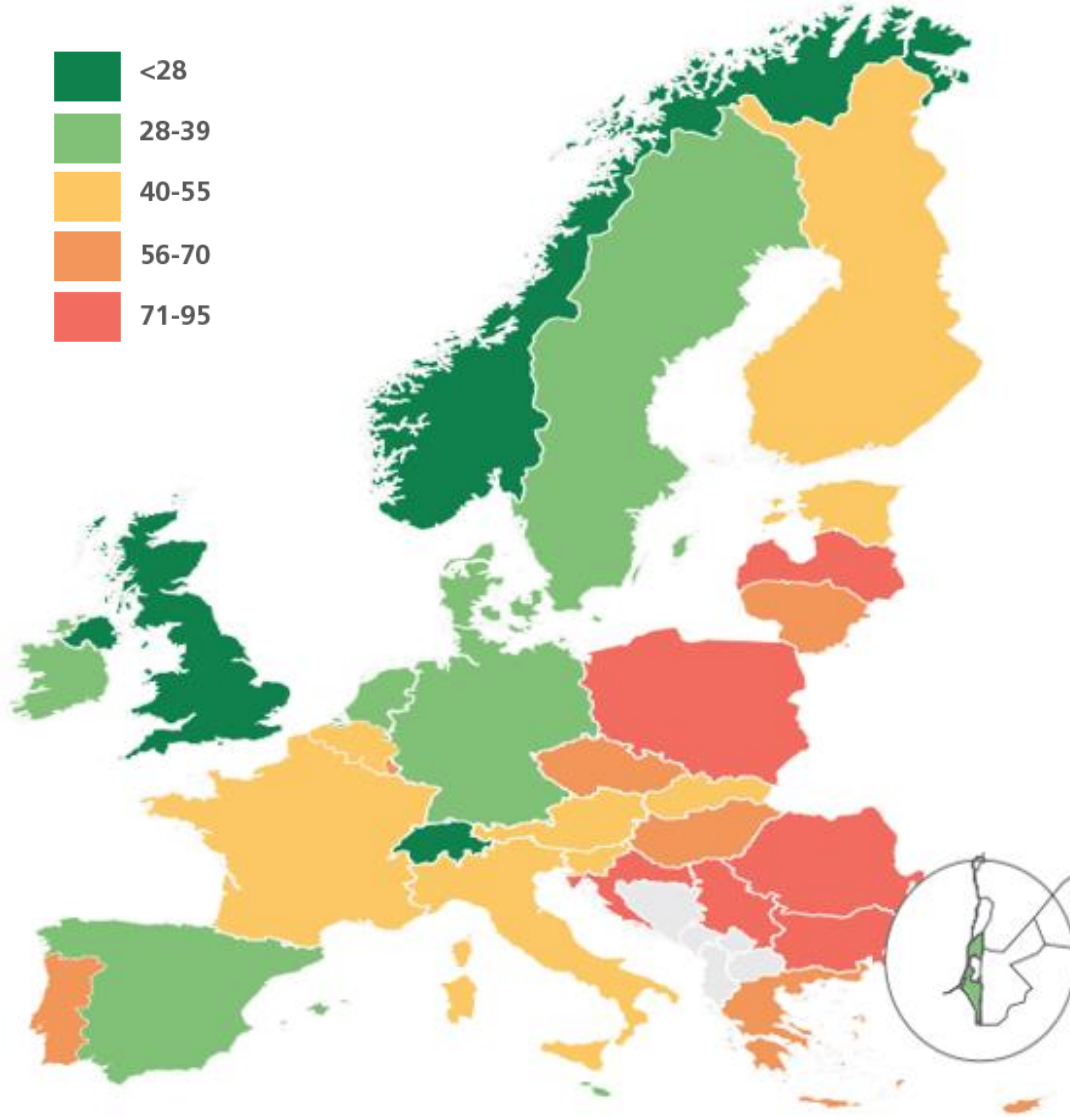
RELATIVE CHANGE (%) IN ROAD DEATHS 2010-2018

DEATHS PER MILLION INHABITANTS IN 2018

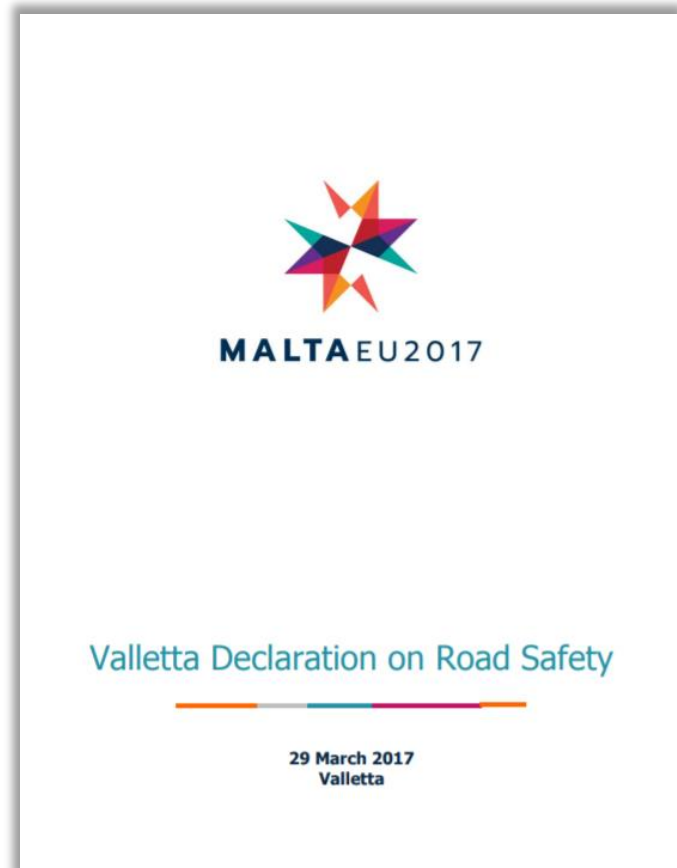
