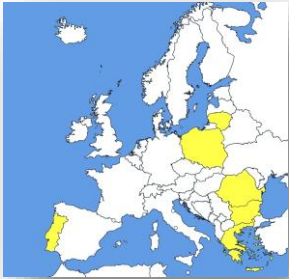

What is the EU Road Safety Exchange? 1/2

- A three-year twinning project (2019-2021) funded by the European Parliament and managed by the European Commission together with ETSC
- Supports exchange of knowledge and best practice between EU Member States.
- Six participating Member States: Bulgaria, Greece, Lithuania, Poland, Portugal, Romania
- Six twinning Member States : Austria, Ireland, France, Spain, Netherlands, Sweden
- The activities include thematic workshops, webinars, study visits, and a best practice seminar in Brussels.

- Six high level national meetings including agreements on priority topics

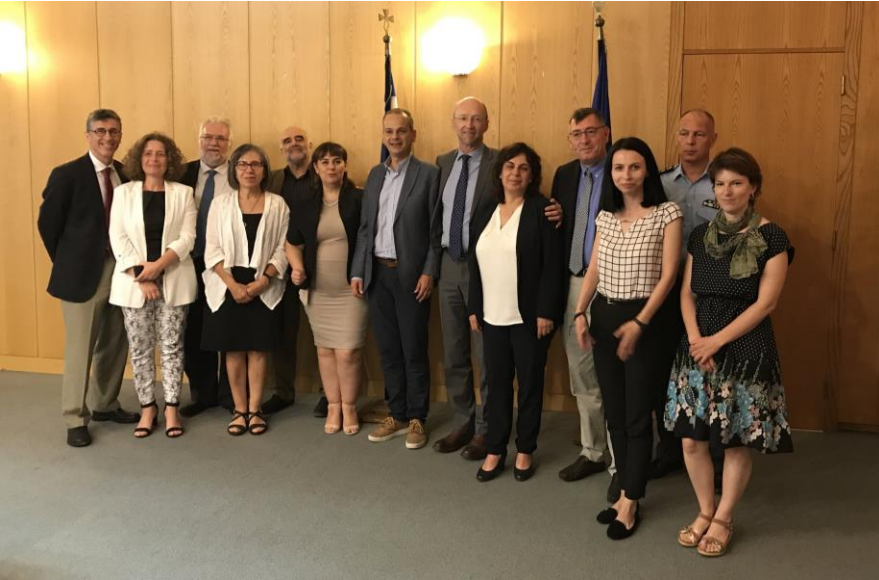


Vilnius, Lithuania, 28th May 2019

- Speeding
- Vulnerable Road Users' safety
- Infrastructure safety

Agreed on two priority topics:

- Drink and drug driving
- Urban road safety – focus on infrastructure and speed management

Sofia, Bulgaria, 4th July 2019
Meeting with High Level Representatives from the Ministry of Interior, Ministry of Transport and Ministry of Regional Development and the State Agency for Road Safety.

Agreed on two priority topics:

- Infrastructure safety
- Enforcement chain

High Level Launch Event : today!

- Gather all participating countries, twinning experts, the European Commission and ETSC in the framework of a celebratory launch event, but also set the frame for the exchanges.
