

WHAT IS THE IMPORTANCE OF THE EUROPEAN SUPPLIER INDUSTRY?



- CLEPA strongly supports and urges the revision of the General Safety
 Regulation as the main driver for achieving the EU road safety targets in 2020
- It is particularly positive that the Commission proposal includes the full set of safety measures, opting for the maximum reduction of road fatalities and severe injuries: this will firmly contribute to saving lives across the EU as unfortunately, in the recent years the casualty reduction has stagnated therefore further measures are required
- Time is now a critical factor, after the long awaited Commission proposal it may be considered shortening the application timeline in order to **avoid further delay**
- We encourage policy makers to work towards a swift conclusion of the codecision procedure within the current legislative period


Importance of the General Safety Regulation



EU target: Reduction of fatalities on roads between 2010 and 2020 by 50%.





Importance of the General Safety Regulation





TPMS systems are technically and economically mature for application in light and heavy commercial vehicles.

Proper tyre pressure can reduce LDV & HDV related accidents by 4% to 20% (TNO 2013)

53% of road breakdowns for HDV is tyre related (ATA 2008) and the average cost for HDV tyre blowout is 251,000US\$ (FCMSA 2011).



- The adoption of the GSR by the Commission is an important step for safer roads and will save lives
- The sooner it will be implemented the more lives will be saved, therefore a review of the application timeline could be considered
- ✓ The swift conclusion of the legislative debate between the Parliament and the Council, within this legislative period would be ideal.
