## **About the YEARS project**

YEARS (Young Europeans Acting for Road Safety) is a three-year project run by the European Transport Safety Council (ETSC) and the Parliamentary Advisory Council for Transport Safety in the UK (PACTS). The project seeks to gain a better understanding of young road users and the risks they face on the road.

This policy report, looks at the current situation in Europe, using the latest data on road deaths involving young people and the main risks they face in their first years of driving and riding. It explores example of good practice and effective measures that can be promoted.

The project will also mobilise university students to take action by running communication campaigns aimed at preventing young road users' deaths in their local area. In this latter stage the focus will broaden to cover the safety of pedestrians and cyclists as well.

The YEARS project receives financial support from the European Commission, the German Road Safety Council (DVR) and the Belgian Road Safety Institute.
